Special Exhibit opening February 4  
Oriental's History Museum**

Stop into the museum and learn about Pamlico County wildlife. Bears, bobcats, coyotes and other small species such as minks and weasels are frequently sighted in the local area. The exhibit will feature information as well as photos from local photographers. On display will be a mounted bobcat preserved by a taxidermist. This beautiful animal met an untimely death after being hit on Route 55 outside of Stonewall.

If you have never seen a bobcat don't miss this opportunity. Also on display will be photos and profiles of other local wildlife.
