

ORIENTAL TOWN BOARD MEETING

Tuesday, October 3, 2017 at 7pm 507 Church Street, Oriental, NC *Mayor Sally Belangia Officiating*

The Town Board of Oriental Town Board Meeting on Tuesday, October 3, 2017 was called to order at 7pm. The Mayor Sally Belangia determined a quorum to be present. She said we have a Public Comment period, if you wish to speak please make sure you are signed up on the sheet. We will call the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present: Mayor Sally Belangia, Pro Tempore Barbara Venturi, Commissioner Overcash, Commissioner White, Commissioner Winfrey, Commissioner Price, Town Manager Diane Miller, Deputy Finance Director Tammy Cox, Administrative Assistant Jeannine Russo, Officer Nicholas Blayney, Norma Yanez, Representative from Waste Industries and Members of the Public.

1. Approval of Agenda

 (a) Commissioner Venturi made a MOTION to approve the Agenda, seconded by Commissioner White. Motion passed 5-0.

2. Consent Agenda: (Tab 1)

(a) Consider Approval of Minutes from Town Board Regular Meeting September 5, 2017

Commissioner Overcash made a MOTION to approve the Consent Agenda, seconded by Commissioner Winfrey. Motion passed 5-0.

3. Public Comment Period: Mayor Belangia asked if anyone would like to speak. Limit comments to 3 minutes and comments to full board not individual.

Knute Bysheim: Mr. Bysheim had questions about adopting the definitions of a commercial travel lift not to exceed 35 tons. Will his travel lift be limited – he has a permit.

Madeline Sutter, 300 Whittaker Point Road: Mrs. Sutter believes we are becoming less of a community and more business oriented. She also mentioned poor drainage issues at her home and spoke about Bay River Sewer and Cayton Plumbing using the right of ways and Town property. She stated that she was "fobbed off" when calling Bay River. Made reference to the Fulcher project and noted that, to date, he has not broken any laws and does employ a certain number of people.

4. Public Hearing: GMO changes to the Permissible Use Table

 Commissioner White made a **MOTION** to open the Public Hearing. Seconded by **Commissioner Venturi.** Motion passed 5-0.

Manager Miller stated the purpose of the Public Hearing is to review the proposed changes to the Permissible Use Table. The Planning Board worked through several workshops to revise the table in response to objections to the last SUP request. The Planning Board would like the Board to know that there will be more revisions to the sections concerning rehabilitation facilities but they are forwarding this list as finished work on sections 1.000 through 6.000 and note that some uses have been moved to other sections as they felt this was more appropriate placement. Several definitions have been added defining light, medium and heavy industry and the definition of halfway houses has been changed to become consistent with the Fair Housing Standards Act. Changes may be made after the Public Hearing. The draft presented to the Board this evening reflects the approved version by the Planning Board that has been legally reviewed and adjusted.

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Planning Board Chair Eric Dammeyer stated that the Planning Board worked on the Table from its beginning to 9.25 and will keep going but things "mushroomed" as they were working. The definition of halfway houses was moved. Housing cannot be limited due to disability, however, we can limit criminals and anyone who is a danger to

- the public. Section 4 addressed the three levels of industry (light, medium and heavy) and will zone out heavy industry.
- Manager Miller: Spoke with our attorney: heavy industry, by definition, is more likely to cause pollution. Due to
- environmental sensitivity, we are within our rights to zone this out.
- 59 Eric Dammeyer: Concerned that toxins being removed metals, chemicals can become airborne. Should we
- make an exception for high-pressure bottom spraying?
- 61 Commissioner Overcash: Stated CAMA can regulate things we cannot control.
- 62 Eric Dammeyer: Sand blasting and scaling can be heard for a mile.
- 63 Manager Miller: We would address new ventures but they must be enclosed.
- 64 Eric Dammeyer: Such existing businesses are grandfathered in.
- Bonnie Knapp: Regarding changes to R1, low density residential, schools, libraries, galleries, religious institutions
- are not allowed and proposed changes will have a negative influence on the community and should remain a "purely residential community." Please keep restricted.
- Rick Knapp: When you buy in an area, you research and do your homework and stated "it is not fair to change the game in the middle."
- Madeline Sutter: We need to know the risk involved and states after one Cayton project, she was unable to leave her home due to gravel in her driveway.
- Greg Bohmert: Referring to the definitions, boat and ship scaling, all contained. Once you say yes to these things, businesses like his cannot exist and feels these items seem counterproductive.
- Commissioner White made a MOTION to close the Public Hearing. Seconded by Commissioner Overcash.
 Motion passed 5-0.
- 78 Discussion:

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- Commissioner Overcash: Regarding Knute Bysheim's comment he has a legal SUP granted and would be grandfathered. He did not specify the capacity.
- 81 Commissioner Venturi: How big is this lift?
- Knute Bysheim: Lift is rated to 65 tons but only lifts 20-30 tons.
- 83 Commissioner Overcash: Regarding 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3, we can restrict.
- Commissioner White: R1 is not completely restricted. The SUP process cannot allow a permit under "not in harmony."
- Greg Bohmert: Can he have a heavy lift crane that can be retracted? The more over capacity, the less likely for an accident as there is more leeway.
- 88 Commissioner Overcash: What is the criteria for a light crane?
- 89 Eric Dammeyer: 30' seemed to be a common height.
- 90 Commissioner Overcash: We need to revisit.
 - **Greg Bohmert:** Things not allowed to offer counterproductive.
- 92 Commissioner Overcash: Environmental health of the Town is foremost as he and David are advisors to the
- 93 Planning Board.94
- Commissioner Overcash made a MOTION to table until the next meeting. Seconded by Commissioner Winfrey.
 Motion passed 5-0.
 - Commissioner Venturi commends the Planning Board and thanks them for their effort.
- 100 5. Waste Industries Contract:
- Waste Industries has purchased GDS and is in the process of securing and putting on line new equipment. They will also be checking our receptacles for wear and replacement. It will take some time for the changeover and likely will
- come with slight issues until the process is fully turned over and new personnel are used to our route. Attached is a
- 104 contract that extends our contract with GDS to Waste Industries until the agreed upon end. Manager Miller is
- 105 requesting authorization to execute this document. Norma Yanez, a representative of Waste Industries attended the
- meeting. She stated there should be very little change. Our calls will now be answered in New Bern rather than a call
- 107 center. There was a question from the public regarding the trucks with the automated arm, Ms. Yanez stated that the
- reason for these trucks is safety and that they have had incidents where workers were hurt as a result of being hit by

vehicles that could not stop. Cecily Lohmar inquired about new trucks in the future, if the weight would remain the same; Ms. Yanez stated they will.

112 Commissioner Overcash made a MOTION to execute the document. Seconded by Commissioner Winfrey.
113 Motion passed 5-0.

6. Project Ordinances

Manager Miller requests that the Board approve a Project Ordinance for 3 separate Grant Projects. The Town has received more than \$500,000 in Grant Funds through the Whittaker Creek Dredging project — as agreed previously, resolution supporting already passed, grant documents executed, please approve; Pierce Creek Dredging project — as agreed previously, resolution supporting passed, grant documents executed, please approve; and Raccoon Creek Flood Abatement Engineering Study — as agreed previously, resolution supporting passed, grant documents executed, please approve.

Commissioner Venturi made a MOTION to approve the Project Ordinance. Seconded by Commissioner White. Motion passed 5-0.

7. Noise Ordinance

Manager Miller asks the Board to approve an amendment to the Chapter H as follows: to change the beginning time in Section 3, Letters (f) and (m) from 11pm to 9pm and in Section 5, Letters (a) and (b) to change Chief of Police to Oriental Police Officer.

Commissioner White made a MOTION to approve the Amendment to the Noise Ordinance. Seconded by Commissioner Overcash. Motion passed 5-0.

8. CDBG support resolution

Pamlico County has begun the process to secure CDBG funds for flood mitigation. Mayor Belangia represented the Town at a meeting with County Manager Tim Buck concerning Oriental's participation. The attached Resolution is required. **Commissioner White** inquired if this is in addition to FEMA and it is.

Commissioner White made a MOTION to adopt the application. Seconded by Commissioner Overcash. Motion passed 5-0.

9. Budget Amendment:

Budget Amendment #2 account for an unforeseen expense in Tourism – the reprinting of the maps/brochures that are distributed up and down the Eastern Seaboard for Tourism. Funds are pulled from the reserve. Manager Miller is asking the Board to please allocate these funds.

Commissioner Venturi made a MOTION to approve. Seconded by Commissioner White. Motion passed 5-0.

Commissioner Overcash added that we did not pay for the design, it was created by ECU students.

10. Gravel/Paving of Gilgo/Windward:

The Manager requests direction on potential paving of temporary road installed by Bay River during their rehabilitation process. Quotes were discussed. The bill from Cayton was approximately \$7,900. Anderson Paving is \$12,500. A.J. and Son Asphalt Specialists gave us two options – a single layer at a cost of \$5,000 or a double layer with a binder at a cost of \$9,000. There was discussion; Commissioner Overcash asked if one layer would suffice.

Commissioner White stated he believed it would be better for trucks if the road were wider. A Town resident stated that lines would be helpful. Commissioner Venturi felt a single layer with lines would do.

Commissioner White made a **MOTION** to allow for the \$9,000 – the double layer with lines at the Manager's discretion, Seconded by **Commissioner Price**. Motion passed 5-0.

11. Fulcher CAMA Permit response required

A CAMA permit request was delivered on 9/22/17 for comment as the adjacent landowner. A revised MP-4 was sent to Manager Miller at 3:40pm on 10/3/17. Manager Miller will discuss the new project and potential issues and requests direction on draft response. There is now no boatlift or travel lift, and no new fuel facilities. Will there be sampling of storm water? Will samples be submitted on an annual basis? Are they holding to their permit? With the new permit, they seek to repair and replace the dock. Manager Miller seeks approval the response to CAMA. A resident asked what the huge tanks are; are they replacement fuel tanks? Manager Miller will give a revised response.

Commissioner Overcash made a MOTION to approve. Seconded by Commissioner Winfrey. Motion passed 5-0.

Commissioner White asked if this is a reply to CAMA, it is.

12. Public Hearing requests

- 1. The Planning Board requests a new Public Hearing be set for the remaining corrections to the Permissible Use Table.
- 2. Mr. Dutton's SUP request, which was cancelled for this month, is requested to be put back on the agenda for November in the hopes he can secure the documentation from all owners to re-file the plat for Seahorse Landing.
- 3. Annexation request by Mr. Billy Flockhart for Piggly Wiggly

Commissioner White made a MOTION to schedule the Public Hearings for our next Board Meeting. Commissioner White also made a MOTION to move the November 7th Board Meeting to November 8th at 7pm. Seconded by Commissioner Winfrey. Motion passed 5-0.

14. Street Closing request:

 Harbor Waterfronts Board has organized a celebration of our waterfront on October 19 at Town Dock 1. Request (per legal advice) to close the street in front of the Dock from 12:30-2:30pm for this event – hot dogs from the Piglet and music on the deck of the Bean.

Commissioner White made a **MOTION** to close Hodges Street from South Water to Main Street. Seconded by **Commissioner Overcash.** Motion passed 5-0.
