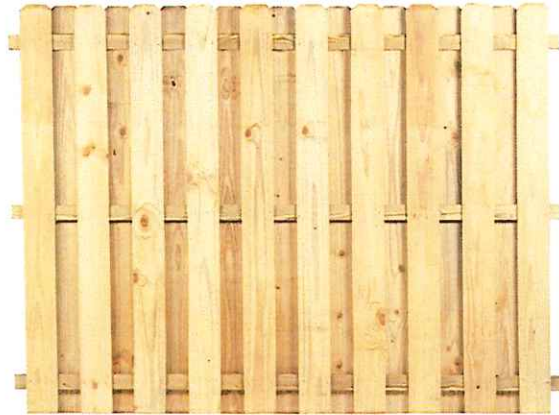

Thank you for your comments, Ms. Anderson. I will forward them on to the Board.

You should know, however, that the dumpsters are there because we have people there 5 days a week and cameras on the site, through which we have found and ticketed illegal dumping. It would likely turn into a trash bin at the Rec site- which is why recycling is only there one day a week- with an attendant.

I am also opposed to a vegetative buffer. We took the old one out because we could not control the thorny vines that inevitably come with a vegetative buffer- and the maintenance required. If the dumpsters remain, staff recommends a privacy fence from driveway to driveway.

We do not own the land nor have cameras on the Wildlife Ramp, which would be more of an issue with trash dumping at the water's edge.

The Board will likely be reconsidering the green waste dumpsters altogether, in light of this issue.

Good Morning ... I am one of the residents who signed the petition asking that some kind of screen be established at the water plant. As you know, the dumpsters fill up quickly, so despite the signs, residents continue to dump their yard debris on the ground. Removing the wax myrtle screen has created more of an eyesore.

I would like to suggest the Town contact Rachel Tipton at Harbourside Gardens in Bayboro (745-0010) and invite her to the March 1 meeting. She is a well-regarded professional horticulturist and could offer suggestions for potential screening options.

The best alternative would be to find another site for the dumpsters. Everyone who uses them comes by vehicle and could drive to another site. Would the Fish and Wildlife ramp or the recycling site behind the fire department be suitable?
