Introduction: The need for a stand-alone library was identified in 2018. After a community survey and requirements working session in early 2019, the initial design took shape and was estimated to cost \$1.5 – \$2.0 million. This figure was later revised to \$2.5 million due to the effects of the pandemic. The acquisition of Hardee's was separate from the aforementioned estimates. Subsequently, two North Carolina government grants were approved to support the new library initiative. Significantly, inflation, worker shortages, and supply chain delays abound throughout the country.
