Week 3: Web Basics Thursday August 19th

Learn the basics of the World Wide Web.

Length: 1 hour

Class Objectives

You will be able to:

- Distinguish between the Internet and the World Wide Web (www.)
- Identify and navigate the basic elements and features of a internet browser
- Navigate the Web using hyperlinks
- Explore the features and advantages of various search engines
- Perform simple Web searches and interpret results
- Internet security and password managers

Week 4 EMAIL BASICS Thursday August 26th

Learn the basics of Web-based e-mail.

Length: 1 hour

Class Objectives

You will be able to:

- Identify and navigate the basic feature and elements of a Web-based email environment
- Read, send, forward and reply to e-mail messages
- Apply formatting features to e-mail transmissions
- Attach documents and graphics to an e-mail transmission
- Activate email options, e.g. signature, vacation responses, etc.
- Create folders and insert email addresses into an address book
- Print from an email
- Use appropriate email etiquette and identify e-mail abuse
