ORIENTAL ROTARY CLUB TARPON TOURNAMENT

2011 will mark the 19th year for the Tarpon Tournament. Beginning in 1992 the Tarpon Tournament held in Oriental, NC features some of the best Tarpon action north of Florida and one of the only tournaments to be held outside of Florida on the east coast. The lower Neuse River Basin opening into the Pamlico Sound features broad waters, scenic panoramas and excellent Tarpon fishing. While the area offers numerous Speckled Trout tournaments throughout the summer and fall, the Tarpon tournament is where a big game fisherman's prowess is tested. Judged by many to be one of the world's most exciting game fish, the average Tarpon landed is 25 to 80 lbs with the world tackle record at 283 lbs 4 ounces.

The tournament as originally established continues to use the proceeds towards scholarships for eligible high school graduates who wish to further their education. Scholarships to date have been in excess of \$250,000 with five scholarships awarded in 2011. As exciting as the fishing is, those which might be attending but not fishing will have an opportunity to discover the magic of the local surroundings. Oriental, which was originally established as a fishing village, is now occupied by numerous restaurants, marinas and a wealth of historically significant houses. The tournament itself also offers numerous events including live music, food and great hospitality.
